## Medicare Advantage

Some Medicare Advantage Plans offer nonemergency medical transportation services for members. This service is completely dependent on the individual plan.

**Note:** Original Medicare (Parts A & B) and Medicare Supplement (Medigap) plans **do not cover** routine transportation to medical appointments.

**If you have a Medicare Advantage Plan (Part C), you may contact your plan directly to see if they offer transportation as a service.**

**Not sure what Medicare plan you are enrolled in?** Below are three ways you can find out:

- 1)** Check to see if you have an **insurance card** other than your red, white, and blue Medicare card and separate from any Part D prescription drug card. If you have one that says PPO, HMO, or Medicare Advantage, you may currently be enrolled in a Part C Medicare Advantage Plan. Call the number on your card to confirm your enrollment and ask about transportation services.
- 2)** Call **1-800-MEDICARE** (1-800-633-4227) to be connected with a Medicare representative. They can tell you what plan you are enrolled in and if transportation is offered as a benefit.
- 3)** Go online to **Medicare.gov** and create an account to view the plan you are currently enrolled in. This will also provide you with the contact information to call the plan or go online to their website to learn more including if transportation is a service offered.
