Faith City Mission provides a secure, clean, and welcoming environment for men and women seeking shelter. Their women's shelter accommodates approximately 28 women and the men's shelter can accommodate approximately 40 men. They ensure that each guest has a place to sleep in comfort and security. Upon arrival, everyone receives freshly laundered sheets, blankets, and access to clean showers and scrubs.

Family Support Services Safe House provides safety, shelter, food and necessities to individuals and families in urgent need of safety from violence. We provide three meals per day to all residents in the home. Advocates are on-site at all times, with the goal of assisting individuals and families to assess needs, case manage for stabilization and short-term and long-term goals, as well as assist in linking to other services as needed.
