Medicaid

Nonemergency medical transportation services are available for Medicaid beneficiaries. These services include rides to a doctor's office, dentist's office, hospital, drug store or any place that provides covered health care services.

Not sure if you are receiving Medicaid? Below are three ways you can find out:

- 1) Check to see if you have a card that says **STAR+PLUS**. If so, you are enrolled in Medicaid and have access to transportation services. Call the number above or on your card to request a ride.
- 2) Call **2-1-1** to be connected with a Texas Health and Human Services Representative. They can check the status of your benefits.
- 3) Go online to **YourTexasBenefits.com** to see if you are enrolled.
